# Voting Laws



**Right to vote:** People with disabilities have a right to vote.

Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. § 12132

**Getting help:** People who need help voting can get help from anyone they want (but not the voter's employer or union officer/agent).

Voting Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 1973aa-6

**Accessibility:** Polling places for federal elections must be accessible.

Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 1973ee

**Guardianship** People under guardianship have a right to vote, unless the court says otherwise.

Minn. Stat. § 204C.08(2023)

## Voting Must-Knows

### 2024 Election Dates

#### Election Day

Tuesday

Nov. 5

#### Vote early

Sept 20 - Nov 4

### Can I register to vote?

#### Yes, if...

- ✓ You are a United States citizen.
- ✓ You are a Minnesota resident.
- ✓ You are 18 or older.
- ✓ A court has not removed your voting rights.
- ✓ You are not currently incarcerated for a felony.

### How do I vote?

- 1) Early by mail
- 2) Early in person
- 3) Election Day at polls

Request an absentee ballot if voting early!

### How do I register?

- 1) Online
- 2) Paper form
- 3) Election Day at polls
